Signing Execution Example

John Doe, Attorney-in-Fact for Jane Doe



Purchase Agreement

- Confirm that the Power of Attorney grants authority to handle real estate transactions prior to signing the Purchase Agreement.
- ✓ Obtain a copy of the executed Power of Attorney.



- Communicate your knowledge regarding use of the Attorney-in-Fact through your closing information sheet and/or email.
- ✓ Provide email and phone contact for the attorney-in-fact and the principal.
- Send a copy of the Power of Attorney along with your Purchase Agreement.
- If the attorney-in-fact will be signing the deed, the original Power of Attorney and Affidavit of Attorney-in-Fact will be required to be recorded at closing.
- An attorney-in-fact cannot assign Power of Attorney to another party.
- Proceeds can only be issued in the form of a check if the attorney-in-fact signs the Proceeds Authorization.
- Any originals will be returned post-recording to the forwarding address provided.



Personal Representative

The Court Appointment of the Personal Representative (Letters Testamentary, Letters of General Administration, etc.)



Signing Execution Example

John Doe, Personal Representative of the Estate of Jane Doe



Purchase Agreement

- ✓ Confirm that the estate has completed the proper proceedings in probate court.
- **⊘** Obtain a copy of the Court Appointment of the Personal Representative.
- Verify the type of deed selected by the purchaser is a Personal Representative's Deed, not a Warranty Deed.



- Communicate your knowledge of the estate through your closing information sheet and/or email.
- Provide Tax ID (EIN) as well as phone and email contact for the personal representative and the probate attorney.
- Send a copy of the Appointment of Personal Representative and any other probate documents along with your Purchase Agreement to be forwarded for examiner review.
- The documents required to be recorded for closing will vary by probate type and may require communication between the probate attorney and TitleSmart, Inc.
- Proceeds will be issued in the form of a check. A wire transfer may be requested if the receiving bank account is held in the name of the estate (not an individual).
- Any originals will be returned post-recording to the forwarding address provided.

John Doe, Trustee of the John Doe Trust



Purchase Agreement

- Confirm that the Trust Agreement identifies your signer as a trustee prior to signing Purchase Agreement.
- Obtain a copy of the Trust Agreement and/or Certificate of Trust.
- Verify the type of deed selected by the purchaser is a Trustee's Deed, not a Warranty Deed.



- Ommunicate your knowledge of the trust through your closing information sheet and/or email.
- Provide Tax ID (EIN/SSN) as well as phone and email contact for the trustee(s).
- Send a copy of the Trust Agreement and/or Certificate of Trust along with your Purchase Agreement to be forwarded for examiner review.
- The Certificate of Trust, Trustee's Affidavit and Trustee's Deed will be required to be recorded at closing.
- If your client is only in possession of a Trust Agreement and/or Certificate of Trust, TitleSmart, Inc. can draft the remaining documents for the transaction.
- Proceeds will be issued in the form of a check. A wire transfer may be requested if the receiving bank account is held in the name of the trust (not an individual).
- Any originals will be returned post-recording to the forwarding address provided.



Business Entity

- ✓ Obtain a copy of the Operating Agreement, Articles of Incorporation or Resolution.



- Communicate your knowledge of the business entity through your closing information sheet and/or email.
- ✓ Provide Tax ID (EIN/SSN) as well as phone and email contact for the signer.
- Send a copy of the Operating Agreement, Articles of Incorporation or Resolution along with your Purchase Agreement to be forwarded for examiner review.
- Proceeds will be issued in the form of a check. A wire transfer may be requested if the receiving bank account is held in the name of the business (not an individual).
